Our students continue to thrive in and out of the classroom. In September, our students got the opportunity to kick off the USF Football season by leading the team onto the field at Raymond James Stadium. In October, our seniors toured both Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University and Florida State

University as they prepared to apply to college.

On campus we teamed up with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated to teach seniors about the importance of financial planning. In November, our students were able to donate over one-hundred care packages for veteran's day and distributed those to the VA hospital in Tampa.

Twenty of our students attended the Florida Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel student leadership conference which brought together 200 students from across the state of Florida. Students attend-

ed workshops and heard from amazing guest speakers about the importance of answering the call to action. Our students have been active at Metropolitan Ministries offering assistance during the holiday season.

Thank you to all of our parents for volunteering and working concessions at Raymond James Stadium. Their hard work helps with gifts at our senior graduation ceremonies each year. In the classroom, over 85% of our students maintain grade point averages above 3.0 and the class of 2015 all went off and successfully enrolled into college. Our students are not only going to college but graduating as well! The past two years have seen college graduation rates in the 60% range which is above the national average for that statistic.

A big thank you to our Upward Bound staff for always going above and beyond the call of duty. Together with our students and parents we continue to be successful as a family. We are excited for 2016 as we prepare for the program's 50th anniversary (1966-2016) and thank you to all of our partners within the USF and Tampa Bay Community!
